

CANNABIS IN THE WORKPLACE

Modern 21st Century society is an ongoing display of scientific advancements, one of which is the improvement of health and safety initiatives in the home and workplace. Another characteristic of modern society is the competition between the conflicting priorities of personal liberty and public safety. The newly revised Cargojet Drug and Alcohol Policy addresses these issues in a way that conforms with industry and regulator best-practices as well as available science.

In the past, toxic chemicals and inadequate equipment routinely claimed lives and caused life-changing injuries. Developments in protective devices and in the understanding of the effects of the compounds we ingest or release into our environment have removed many of the hazards we used to take for granted or accepted simply as a part of life. Accidents still do happen of course, but today it is usually a case of not using, or misusing, available protections rather than an absence of the protections themselves.

In addition to our physical world, we have a better understanding of our psychology and the effects that the mind can have on our physical well-being. Even a mind free of disease or chemical imbalance is still subject to chronic stress in our frantic and demanding technological lives. Everyday pressures have a profound effect on our health, and another advancement has been a focus on things such as work-life balance, and the release of stress through exercise, diet, and social interaction.

The use of cannabis products is where these topics come together. Some seek to relieve stress through the responsible use of intoxicants; in some cases these intoxicants are used in medicine to relieve acute and chronic pain; often, a social setting involves the consumption of such products. Typically, when these products are used responsibly, safety in the workplace is maintained, but impairment of any kind can bring about severe consequences at work or at home.

The effects of alcohol on the body are well known and long studied. Within reasonable variances, blood alcohol levels can be taken as a measure of impairment, and the dissipation of blood alcohol over time is consistent and predictable. While blood alcohol equivalents are frequently used as illustrations of impairment for other intoxicants, this can be dangerously misleading. Cannabis and marijuana and their derivatives are metabolized in significantly different ways than alcohol. Since it has only recently been legalized, unlike alcohol the effects of cannabis on long-term health and on physical and cognitive performance have not been extensively tested and studied by public health agencies and scientists. By their nature though, most cannabis products undoubtedly have mood altering and performance degrading effects. A mind that is impaired in such a way is a poor judge of its own level of impairment.

The active agents of most cannabis products are stored in body tissue; that is, not confined to the bloodstream and nervous system. They can be present for some considerable time as well. Therefore, the traditional "bottle to throttle" benchmark of 12 hours used for alcohol cannot be applied to cannabis, and blood levels cannot measure the extent of impairment. Further, any active agent present in the body tissue is released by the presence of cortisol and adrenalin. Therefore, when the body is under stress (for example in an emergency situation or when there is an increase in physical activity), these active agents are released into the bloodstream. In other words, just when a person needs to be sharp and focused, their own body makes them a bit high.

It is for this reason that the Cargojet Drug and Alcohol Policy is written as it is. Because of the variable nature, and unpredictable onset, of impairment from cannabis, some job classifications are quite restricted for consumption and others are prohibited altogether. We have a responsibility to the public and our co-workers to maintain a high level of safety in the workplace, and we simply do not know enough about cannabis to control its effects in an aviation industry that requires the highest degree of precision and attention to detail to ensure that safety.

The issuance of the Cargojet policy is mandatory as a condition of our certificate, and it is aligned with the other major air operators in Canada as well as the Canadian military and Transport Canada guidelines. Please read the policy carefully, and comply with it completely. Your manager is available at any time to answer questions or concerns, and we appreciate your cooperation in keeping Cargojet safe and secure for all of our team members and customers.

The SMS App is very easy to navigate and contains two main pages: Safety Reporting and Safety Website.

Through the Safety Reporting page you can easily submit Safety Reports that will be automatically sent to the SMS Department. This will be considered as the primary method for reporting concerns.

The Safety Website has also been relocated to this SMS App. You can access all safety related information to include Policies, Safety Objectives, and Safety Trend Reports. Other information such as Company Manuals, Health & Safety documentation and Committees' meeting minutes, Training material, MSDS, and links to relevant and regulatory websites, can also be accessed through the SMS Website.


